ABOUT BEACONSFIELD

Founded as an educational charity in 1994 by artists with the desire to fill a niche between the institution, the commercial and 'alternative', Beaconsfield remains a unique, non-profit, politically engaged, artist-led entity, placing equal emphasis on audiences and artists.

Beaconsfield's reputation rests on the staging of an influential programme of exhibitions, residencies, limited editions and discursive events – commissions (beacons) in a range of art mediums (field). Since 2004 Beaconsfield has worked with artists including Sonia Boyce, Tracey Emin, Bob and Roberta Smith, Ian Hinchliffe, Gustav Metzger, Mark Wallinger and Svein Flygari Johansen among many others, as well as producing projects in conjunction with international arts organisations including the Museum of Contemporary Art Oslo and Tate Britain.

The organisation's function as a primary research vehicle is international and particularly notable for pioneering developments in time-based, political and sound art as well as curatorial practice. We need to raise £250,000 per annum to realise Beaconsfield's full potential as a self-sufficient, critically engaged locus operating beyond the mainstream.
