Over the weekend of 13-14 June 2015, the Monica Ross Action Group invites us to celebrate the life and work of pioneering artist Monica Ross.

As parliament debates whether to abolish the Human Rights Act, posterity may see **Anniversary – an act of Memory** as the seminal work of her career. The work entailed sixty public recitations by the artist of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, by memory, with 60 different communities across the UK and beyond. On the 14 June 2013, the day of the sixtieth and concluding recitation of Anniversary—an act of memory that took place at the 23rd session of the United Nations Human Rights Council in Geneva, Switzerland, Monica Ross died of cancer.


On 13 June, the premier screening of Bernard G Mills' video documentation *Anniversary—an act of memory solo, collective and multi-lingual recitations from memory of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, a performance series in 60 Acts, Monica Ross and Co-Recitors 2008-2013* will be shown all day at Beaconsfield. Documentation of the scrolls made as a hand-written record of each Act, signed by each participant in her/his own language will also be on display.

On 14 June, Andrew Michelson will lead an enactment of the work at the British Library marking the British Library's acquisition of Ross' complete archive and the anniversary of Monica Ross' death in the context of the anniversary of the Magna Carta, Britain's first iteration of human rights.
